PREFACE

Whether it is course work in a classroom setting or professional-clinical courses and workshops or individualized learning, the students of law have the advantages of a skilled guidance of the teachers in a warm, collegial and picturesque environment.

Fareast International University remains committed to provide legal education in LLM program as an education for both generalists and specialized group. Students with particular interests will find it possible to study topics in depth through advanced and more specialized courses. Emphasizing the acquisition of broad and basic knowledge of law, an understanding of the functioning of the legal system, and the development of analytic abilities of the highest order, Fareast International University's legal education prepares students for any professional role they might choose--legal practice or legal education, entrepreneurial ventures, international private or public law practice, corporate practice, government service, alternative dispute resolution including arbitration and mediation, or work with non-profit organizations.

Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) (4 years Hon's Program)

Fareast international University Bangladesh aims to introduce Four-Year LL.B course to facilitate students to obtain an LL.B.(Hon's) Degree in twelve semesters within a span of four academic years. The programme aims to provide a broader legal understanding and academic discipline. It aims to enable a student to acquire firm understanding of legal principles and their legal knowledge in various areas of law. It will help them to train themselves to be an excellent legal practitioner.

Although the primary emphasis of the program is on law and the legal profession, it would also prepare persons who might be planning on a career in the Government, Judicial service, business, non-governmental organizations and social sectors dealing with law and legal activities.

The programme has been focused to develop the capabilities to identify and grow new opportunities and integrate theoretical knowledge with the capacity to apply such knowledge in practice.

There are formal final examinations in most subjects and all works carried out in the programme are considered in the overall assessment. A satisfactory record of class work will also be required at each stage.

Duration of Study and Semester System

The duration of the program will be 4(four) academic years. Law Faculty of Fareast International University, Bangladesh offers Four-Year LL.B. (Hon's) Degree comprising twelve semesters within a span of four academic years. Each academic year is divided into three semesters namely Spring (January to April), Summer (May to August) and Fall (September to December).

Academic Calendar

The Faculty has preferred to adopt the semester system to the yearly system. An Academic year will consist of three semesters with 4 months duration in each semester which will be allotted in the following manner:

There shall be a time period of total 16 weeks. 14 weeks will be spent for class-room instructions and 2 weeks will be required for registration and examinations.

Lecture Hour per Course

The procedure of credit hour semester system will be practiced in the academic program of Fareast International University having involvement of (14) weeks of instruction in each semester and courses may have different credit hours having involvement of 14 instruction weeks under each specific credit hour.

In this context, there shall have a 3 credit hours course having 14 instruction weeks 1 course = 3 Credit Hours x 14 instruction weeks = 42 hours.

Evaluation Procedure
